Recipient of the AAPI 2023 LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The 2023 "Lifetime Achievement Award" of the American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin to Dr. Ranga Reddy is a tribute to decades of his selfless and illustrious service. Dr. Reddy is an alumnus of Kurnool Medical College, Andhra Pradesh (MBBS and M.S. General Surgery). In the USA, he practiced Anesthesiology for three decades in Springfield, Illinois. He served as the Departmental Chairman at Memorial Medical Center and Clinical Associate Professor at SIU School of Medicine.



Ranga Reddy, MD

His decades of exemplary service to AAPI in various leadership roles, including as President (1997-98) and Member of the Board of Trustees, portrays him as an iconic leader that propelled the organization to the heights of excellence.

Dr. Reddy streamlined the AAPI organizational structure, amended bylaws, and simplified the election process. Dr. Reddy's vision of a strong future for AAPI resulted in his instituting "Annual AAPI Legislative Conference Day" on Capitol Hill, Washington D.C., to represent the interests of the Indo-US Physicians. He brought newly emerging information technology to the doorsteps of AAPI and enhanced communication channels with the membership. He is also the Founder-Member of the Association of Telugu Medical Graduates in the USA (ATMGUSA).

Dr. Ranga Reddy is the recipient of several prestigious awards and honors, such as the Distinguished Service Award (AAPI), Recognition Award (International College of Surgeons), Outstanding Service Awards (ATMGUSA and American Telugu Association), and Mahatma Gandhi Sesqui-centennial medallion of excellence from Metropolitan Asian Family Services, Chicago.

He is the PI on multiple ongoing brain tumors and brain metastases clinical trials.

He also chairs the scientific advisory committee of Guardian Research Network (GRN), a nationwide healthcare alliance. He currently serves as the chair of the US National Cancer Institute (NCI) South-West Oncology Group (SWOG) Brain Tumor Working Group and Co-chair of the Diversity Equity and Inclusion committee of SWOG. He is founding PI of the coordinating site for the International Radiosurgery Research Foundation.

Dr. Ahluwalia has received several prestigious awards, including the Fellowship of the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO), the National Cancer Institute/CTEP Career Development Award via the American Brain Tumor Consortium (ABTC), ASCO Leadership Development Program, amongst others.

Non communicable diseases (NCDs), the so-called "silent killers", account for a significant morbidity and mortality in rural India. The American Association of Physicians of Indian Origin (AAPI) has launched a Rural Health Initiative to do free screening for NCDs including diabetes, hypertension, hyper-cholesterolemia, chronic kidney disease, anemia, hypoxemia and malnutrition.

CBC, HbAlC, lipid profile, creatinine, pulse oximetry, measurement of blood pressure, height and weight were the tests and measurements included in the screening. Counseling is provided if anyone has abnormal results. To date, we have screened close to 8000 people in 6 states including Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, and Telangana. We recently signed an MOU with Doctors of Rajasthan International (DORI) to carry out the project in several villages in the state of Rajasthan.

The data collected from the screenings has been very educational and intriguing which will help us establish a preventive health task force in India. We are indebted to the sponsors and our collaborating partner Global Teleclinics, for being part of this noble project.



THERAPEUTIC EFFECTS OF LIFESTYLE MODIFICATION IN PREVENTION AND TREATMENT OF CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASES

The last four decades have seen rapid improvement in the availability pharmacotherapy pertaining to cardio-vascular diseases (CVD). The utilization of outcome data from randomized controlled studies has resulted in development of protocols for disease management and has resulted in system improvement. addition, there have been rapid advancements in development of advanced therapeutic procedures for management of vascular diseases. Despite the widespread availability of pharmaco-therapy, and invasive procedures, the mortality related to cardiovascular disease remains high, and continues to be the leading cause of death in the USA and other parts of the world. There is a need to re-evaluate the existing strategy and apply any and every available measure to prevent and treat the CV disease.

Thus far, based upon Framingham study data, efforts were primarily focused on traditional risk factors modification, such as; hypertension, diabetes, hyperlipidemia, tobacco Smoking and family history of premature CAD.

The available observational data has clearly demonstrated the importance of lifestyle choices such as dietary changes, performance of regular exercise and cessation of smoking in prevention of CV disease. A targeted approach geared towards behavior modification may improve cardiovascular morbidity and mortality.

The aim of this review is to summarize the salutary effects of lifestyle modification on preventing CVD. In addition, its effect in decreasing the progression of disease in individuals with established CVD will be discussed.

The pillars of healthy lifestyle include: good activity, nutrition, regular physical restorative Sleep, avoidance of substances associated with adverse cardiovascular stress management positive establishment/maintenance of social connections. The available data from research studies has shown that adopting a healthy lifestyle can lower the risk of of development CV disease by approximately 80% and can significantly mitigate the severity of existing illness. It is felt that by following these 6 pillars of lifestyle modification, the risk of development/progression of various CV diseases such as hypertension, coronary artery disease, atrial fibrillation, congestive heart failure, and peripheral vascular disease can be decreased several folds. Nutrition:

There is existing data from a number of Meta analyses that directly/ indirectly link diets rich in sodium, / fat content or low in fiber, with increased risk of cardiovascular morbidity and mortality. This INTERSALT study has shown that high Sodium intake results in development of hypertension. In addition, ingestion of diets rich in refined carbohydrates and low fiber content results in insulin resistance. Where as, intake of whole grains, complex carbohydrates and fresh fruits tend to mitigate the above stated risk.

There are multiple national and guidelines International society that recommend DASH diet- A diet, which consists of fresh fruits, vegetables, nuts, legumes, seeds, low fat diary and lean meats. The use of DASH diet has been proven to reduce the risk of systemic hypertension. In addition diets rich in vegetables and fruits tend to result in a favorable lipid profile. The ACC/AHA also supports consumption of unprocessed plant-based diets.

THERAPEUTIC EFFECTS OF LIFESTYLE MODIFICATION IN PREVENTION AND TREATMENT OF CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASES

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY:

In 2019 ACC/AHA has published guidelines relating to prevention of cardiovascular disease in adult population. The recommend guidelines that adults min/week of perform at least 150 cumulative moderate intensity exercise or 75 min/week of vigorous intensity aerobic addition, has been activity. In it recommended that resistance training oriented towards muscle strengthening be performed at least twice a week.

The cardiovascular benefits of exercise are mediated through antithrombotic, antiatherogenic, antiarrhythmic hemodynamic effects; addition, in exercise has emotional, psychological and social benefits. An increase in physical activity has been shown to be beneficial in controlling traditional risk factors for CV diseases, such as diabetes, hyperlipidemia and hypertension. Similarly, they people benefit established cardiovascular disease by preventing disease progression. In addition physical conditioning in patients with heart failure increases the exercise capacity improves the sense of well being and decreases the risk of sudden cardiac death.

RESTORATIVE SLEEP:

The American Academy of Sleep Medicine Sleep and research Society the recommend 7-8 hours of uninterrupted sleep at night. Some of the clinical studies show a correlation between the risk of CVD mortality with inadequate sleep (less than 7 hours) or excessive sleep (more than 9 hours). It is felt that following principles of sleep hygiene that includes diagnosis and treatment of sleep apnea are important in reducing the CVD burden.

SUBSTANCE USE/ABUSE:

In USA and around the globe, tobacco smoking and alcohol ingestion is endemic and these are the most frequently used/abused substances. The tobacco smoke contains thousands of chemicals and some of these potentially carcinogenic. These toxins are implicated in development CVD affecting the heart rate, increasing the systemic and pulmonary blood pressure, as a result of autonomic dysfunction. There is a decrease in nitric oxide production as a result of endothelial dysfunction, and vascular inflammation. There is a trend towards lowering HDL-C and increasing LDL-C. Tobacco smoking is considered as a causative mechanism for development of peripheral vascular disease, resulting in development of aortic aneurysms, stroke, atrial fibrillation and host of other arrhythmias. The use smokeless Tobacco and secondhand smoking also increase risk of CVD.

The regular use of excessive amount of alcohol or binge drinking been shown to increase risk of hypertension, congestive heart failure and atrial fibrillation. The American college of Physicians/ACC and other medical societies recommend limiting biological males to two drinks alcohol/day and for biological females 1 drink of alcohol /day. This may potentially result in improvement in cardiovascular health. On the contrary, there is also emerging data that indicates a trend towards increase in overall mortality with ingestion of moderate amount of alcohol.

STRESS MANAGEMENT:

The results of INTERHEART study indicate that tobacco smoking and psychological factors have similar (35.7% vs 32,5%) attributable risk of development of MI in the general population. It is a proven fact that presence of baseline depression or post myocardial infarction results in increased risk of all-cause mortality.

THERAPEUTIC EFFECTS OF LIFESTYLE MODIFICATION IN PREVENTION AND TREATMENT OF CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASES

Conversely, positive emotions, such as; a sense of purpose, resilience, gratitude and happiness may improve outcomes post myocardial infarction. The importance of good family support structure cannot be overstated, especially in patients post myocardial infarction or cardiac transplant.

In 2017, The AHA published a position paper that delineates the benefits of meditation on reduction of the risk of CVD. The regular performance of Yoga and meditation are proven, time tested strategies in management of stress and anxiety.

POSITIVE SOCIAL CONNECTIONS

It has been reported that in USA, about 30% of adults over 45 years of age are lonely and approximately, 25% of adults over 65 are totally socially isolated. The presence of poor social support system is associated with increased risk of cardiovascular mortality. The importance of good social support such as personal friends, religious groups and or social clubs are invaluable and go a long way in preventing social isolation.

CONCLUSION:

Although we have made significant strides in diagnosing, preventing and treating cardiovascular diseases, there is a need to focus on lifestyle modifications. These lifestyle changes will have a salutary effect in prevention and treatment of the cardiovascular diseases. The health care cost associated with implementation of behavior modification is minimal to none, but benefits seem to be profound. This paradigm shift can be achieved by educating the general public, health care providers, the policymakers' and the health insurance agencies.

Benjamin Franklin had stated that "An ounce of prevention is better than a pound of cure"; this specially holds true in decreasing the risk of development of cardiovascular disease in the general population. As health care providers we should strive tirelessly for preservation of good health, and wellbeing.

HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS (HPV)

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) is one of the most common sexually transmitted infections worldwide. It is responsible for various health complications including cervical, anal, genital, and oropharyngeal cancers, as well as genital warts. In India, it accounts for second highest number of cancer deaths yearly. Vaccination can significantly reduce the risk of developing cervical cancer by targeting the high-risk HPV strains by preventing these diseases and saving lives. The implementation of the HPV vaccine in India is a vital step towards reducing the burden of cervical cancer and other HPV-related diseases...

To promote the HPV vaccination program, various awareness campaigns and educational initiatives have been undertaken. These campaigns aim to educate parents, girls, and communities about the importance of HPV vaccination.

India has made significant progress in the implementation of HPV vaccination, but there is still a long way to go. AAPI has taken up the project to conduct vaccination drives by providing free vaccines and educating and bringing awareness to the community. The HPV Vaccination Drives were a huge success! AAPI healthcare professionals, with the support of dedicated GHS team and local Physician volunteers, were able to reach and vaccinate many individuals in the community for two consecutive years.



HOW I BUILT MY "SECOND BRAIN" USING CHATGPT

Are you suffering from "AI Anxiety" – caused by the ascent of ChatGPT and the Fear of Missing Out? (FOMO). My wife once told me something she heard on the news: "AI doesn't replace a man, a man who knows how to use AI will. I got alarmed, and I started using AI as my "second brain".

As we recover from the uncertainty of the Covid pandemic, a new uncertainty has emerged in the form of AI technology. Here's my story of how I adapted to this new reality with ChatGPT and AI.

It's important to understand that our "first brain" is not designed to store large amounts of information. Using our brains like a hard drive is like driving a Ferrari in a slow zone. Our brains are meant for imagination, innovation, and creativity. That's where an AI "second brain" comes in. It's great at storing, analyzing, and generating insights from information. Best of all, it is outsourced from your head.

Want to be more productive and focus on what matters? Building an AI second brain can help you do just that. It helps you make the most of the information you consume and put it to use.

Here are the top 5 apps I use daily in my second brain.

I. Chat GPT, new Bing: https://www.bing.com/new

I use Microsoft's new Bing as my personal assistant and researcher. It's powered by the latest GPT-4 technology, it's free to use, and it supports text, image creation, tables, lists, and instant translation to any language. Most importantly, it can answer any question by searching the entire internet. Plus, with microphone input and audio playback, I can save screen time and reduce typing fatigue.

I use simple RCA (Role, Context, Action) mnemonics to prompt ChatGPT.

Role: With Role prompting, all the world is a stage! Start your prompt using phrases such as "act as a..." or "you are a..." or "pretend you are a..." in the prompt, to tell ChatGPT to assume a specific role or persona in the conversation.

Context: situation in which the role is presented, such as the physical environment or the social situation. Understanding the context is important for interpreting and responding appropriately. Action: Describe the specific task that you want ChatGPT to perform within the given role.

Examples:

- Act as cardiologist Dr. Enas Enas (Role) giving a lecture to medical students (Context) and summarize (Action) the challenges of coronary artery disease in Indians.
- My wife has written this Kannada poem (I paste the Baraha format on new Bing). Please translate it to English, Hindi, etc. I ask further to perfect the rhymes, and it does it.

Easy tip: I use Microsoft Edge Browser, and New Bing is always there as my assistant. I "prompt" to teach me complex contents at a seventh grader level.

Feedly AI helps to define what is relevant to you. Sources of information can be monitored all in one place: News site, Newsletter, Blog, Keyword alert, medical journals, YouTube, Podcast, or any RSS feed.


Easy tip: Feedly will put all information into two bullets: Today and Read Later.

5. Learn at the speed of sound: https://www.letsrecast.ai/

Turn your want-to-read articles into relevant audio summaries and easy to understand audio conversations. You can replace your hours of screen time reading with a few minutes of listening time. Microlearning by listening is innate and effortless.

Easy tip: Prompt the Recast to summarize in 2 minutes chunks, and listen when you are away from screen, e.g., dishwashing, exercising.

AI-POWERED HEALTHCARE: A REVOLUTION IN PATIENT CARE:
